El Alcalde y Concejo deciden lo que se debe hacer; el Gerente de la Ciudad, operando por medio de todo el personal de la Ciudad, lo lleva a cabo.

El Alcalde y Concejo se reúnen usualmente los primeros cuatro días martes de cada mes, en el Salón del Alcalde y Concejo, Ayuntamiento, 255 W. Alameda, Tucson, Arizona. Un miembro del Alcalde y el Concilio puede ser presente y tomar parte en una reunión del consejo de administración por asistencia electrónica, sujeto a las condiciones incluidas en las Reglas de Alcalde y Concilio y Regulaciones.

Los asuntos de rutina son programados bajo el encabezado de Agenda de Consentimiento, lo que permite que una cantidad de acciones ocurran con una sola moción.

**9. ZONING: (SE-09-17) AIR CELL – KOLB ROAD, SPECIAL EXCEPTION LAND USE, CITY MANAGER’S REPORT, DIRECT ORDINANCE ADOPTION**

This is a Special Exception Land Use request to allow the installation of a wireless communication monopole with a height of 150 feet (limited by condition to 145 feet), a four-tier antenna arrangement, and associated ground equipment on property located east of Kolb Road, bounded by the Union Pacific Railroad tracks to the north. The applicant is Michael J. Campbell, of Crown Castle International, on behalf of the property owners, Arizona Board of Regents.

The *General Plan* and the *Esmond Station Area Plan* provide relevant policy guidance for the requested rezoning.

The Zoning Examiner and staff recommend approval of the special exception land use.

Zero written property owner approvals and zero written property owner protests were received for this case prior to the Zoning Examiner’s public hearing. A written protest was received from the Rita Ranch Neighborhood Association. The letter argues the pole is too tall and unsightly, and should be relocated to the landfill area. No approvals or protests have been received or rescinded since the public hearing.

- d. Ordinance No. 10761 relating to zoning; a special exception land use – wireless communications tower use – SE-09-17 Air Cell – Kolb Road; approving with conditions the construction of 145 foot tall wireless communications tower for multiple carriers in the RH zone; and setting an effective date.

A simple majority vote will be necessary to approve the rezoning ordinance.

**10. ZONING: (C9-09-09) BROWN FAMILY PARTNERSHIP – SPEEDWAY BLVD, O-3 TO C2, CITY MANAGER’S REPORT, DIRECT ORDINANCE ADOPTION**

The *General Plan* and the *Pantano East Area Plan* provide relevant policy guidance for the requested rezoning.

The Zoning Examiner and staff recommend approval of the City C-2 zoning.

Two written approvals and three written protests were received for this case prior to the Zoning Examiner's public hearing. Subsequent to the Zoning Examiner public hearing, one additional protest was received, for a total of four protests. Two of the protests lie within the 150 foot protest area resulting in a protest by area of 10.73 percent to the south, 11.16 percent to the west, zero percent to the north and east. The protests generally allude to the desire for residential development on the site and concern about future traffic and noise.
