El Alcalde y Concejo deciden lo que se debe hacer; el Gerente de la Ciudad, operando por medio de todo el personal de la Ciudad, lo lleva a cabo.

### SESIONES REGULARES DEL CONCEJO

El Alcalde y Concejo se reúnen usualmente los primeros cuatro días martes de cada mes, en el Salón del Alcalde y Concejo, Ayuntamiento, 255 W. Alameda, Tucson, Arizona. Un miembro del Alcalde y el Concilio puede ser presente y tomar parte en una reunión del consejo de administración por asistencia electrónica, sujeto a las condiciones incluidas en las Reglas de Alcalde y Concilio y Regulaciones.

Los asuntos de rutina son programados bajo el encabezado de Agenda de Consentimiento, lo que permite que una cantidad de acciones ocurran con una sola moción.

**8. PUBLIC HEARING: TUCSON CODE – AMENDING (CHAPTER 23) THE LAND USE CODE; AFFECTING THE LOCATION OF CHARTER SCHOOLS IN SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCES**

**9. PUBLIC HEARING: ZONING (C9-04-20) OASIS BOTTLED WATER – 22<sup>ND</sup> STREET, R-2 TO I-1, REACTIVATION, TIME EXTENSION, CHANGE OF CONDITIONS AND ORDINANCE ADOPTION**

On January 11, 2005, the Mayor and Council voted 7-0 to approve the rezoning request from R-2 to I-1 zoning, subject to certain conditions. The original five-year authorization expired on January 11, 2010.

Staff recommends the Mayor and Council to approve the requested five-year time extension, the change of conditions, and adopt the ordinance, subject to compliance with the revised conditions of rezoning.

- c. Ordinance No. 10773 relating to Zoning; Amending Ordinance No. 10247; amending zoning district boundaries in the area located at the southeast corner of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and Neff Street in case C9-04-20, Oasis Bottled Water, southeast corner of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and Neff Street, R-2 to I-1; and setting an effective date.

One written approval and zero written protests have been received for this case.

A simple majority vote will be necessary to adopt an ordinance rezoning the subject property once the conditions of rezoning are met.

**10. ZONING: (C9-08-10) COT WATER - GOLF LINKS ROAD, SR TO C-2 ZONING, CITY MANAGER'S REPORT, DIRECT ORDINANCE ADOPTION**

- c. Request to rezone property located on the northeast corner of Golf Links and Houghton roads from SR to C-2 zoning. The development package proposes a construction service use, for City of Tucson Water Department service center, comprised of offices, warehouses, shop space and outdoor storage areas. Applicant: Tucson Water.

The *South Pantano Area Plan* and the *General Plan* provides relevant policy guidance for the requested rezoning.

The Zoning Examiner and staff recommend approval of the C-2 zoning.

Two written approvals and four written protests were received for this case prior to the Zoning Examiner's September 25, 2008 public hearing. One additional protest was received during the public hearing process. Four of the protests lie within the 150 foot protest area resulting in a protest by area of 53.39 percent to the east, and zero percent in all other directions. The protests generally allude to concerns about noise and visual impacts.

The applicant indicates the protests have been addressed through site design and layout, building design, screening, and operational changes such as the white noise back-up beepers.

- d. Ordinance No. 10774 relating to zoning: amending zoning district boundaries in the area located on the northeast corner of Golf Links and Houghton Roads in Case C9-08-10, COT Water – Golf Links Road, SR to C-2; and setting an effective date.

A three-fourths majority vote will be necessary to approve the rezoning ordinance.
